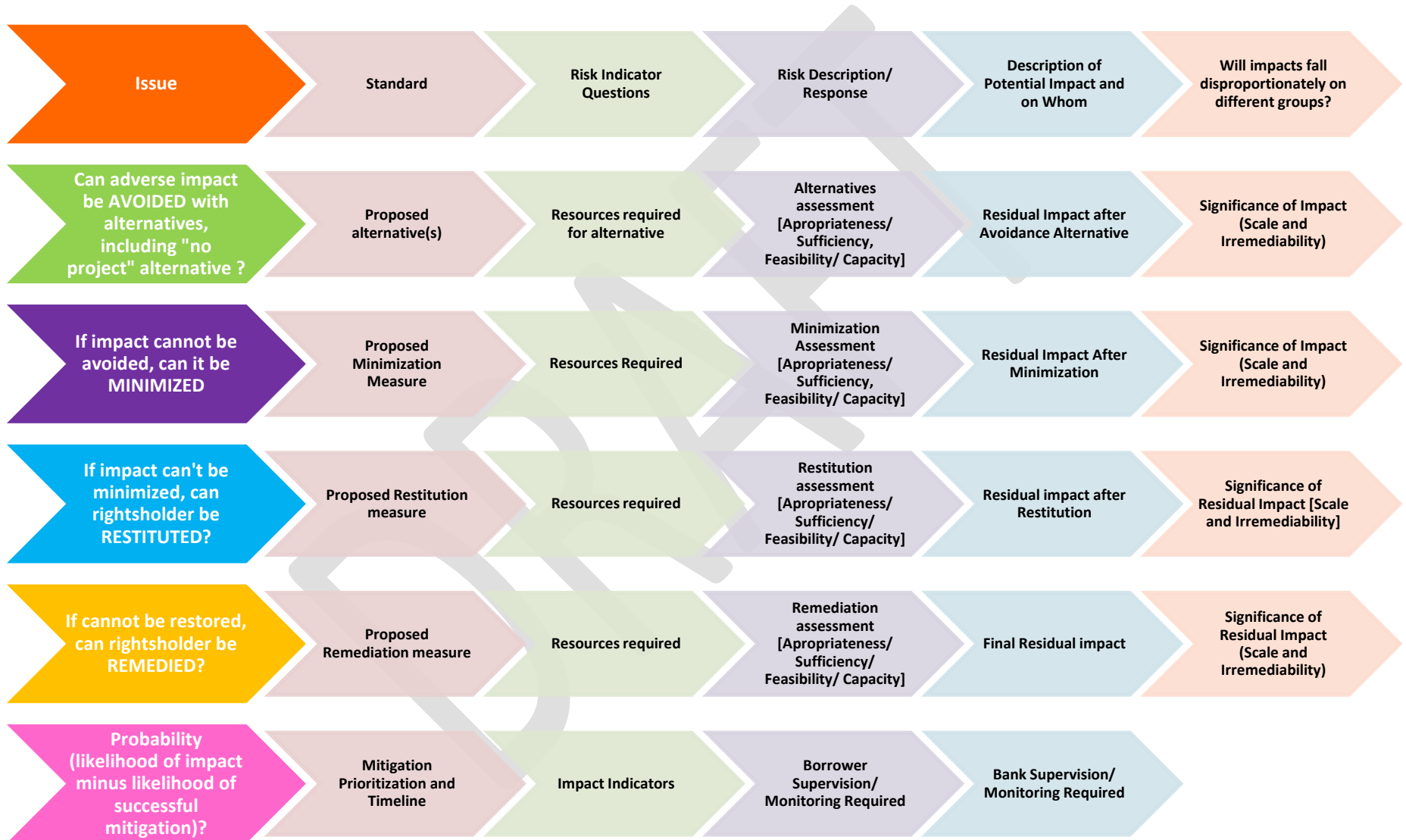

Key aspects of the right to health include the following: Availability (functioning public health and health-care facilities, goods and services must be available in sufficient quantity within a State), Accessibility (the facilities, goods, services, and information must be accessible physically as well as financially and on the basis of non-discrimination), Acceptability (the facilities, goods and services should also respect medical ethics, and be gender-sensitive and culturally appropriate), Good quality (they must be scientifically and medically appropriate and of good quality), Non-discrimination (health services, facilities and goods must be accessible to all without discrimination on any grounds), Participation (the beneficiaries of health care services, facilities and goods should have a voice in the design and implementation of health policies which affect them), Accountability (Duty bearers should be held accountable for meeting human rights obligations in the area of public health, including through the possibility of seeking effective remedies for breaches such as, for example, the denial of treatment), and Underlying determinants of health (such as adequate sanitation and safe drinking water and adequate housing). A non-exhaustive list of the grounds for discrimination recognized and prohibited under international law includes: race, color, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national, ethnic or social origin or descent including caste, property, birth, family or marital status, disability, nationality, age, economic position, geographical residence, HIV status, sexual orientation and gender identity. Discrimination can be direct or indirect. Direct discrimination occurs when an activity is aimed at benefiting or excluding a particular group because of a distinguishing personal characterstic.
